## From the Principal

Welcome to Week 7, a big congratulations to those students who gained their PBL badge in last week's round. We have still one more round to go and we've many students who are "almost there" in achieving their badges. Our students are aware of what has to be worked on and it's up to them to work hard to achieve their goals and receive their badge.

Our final plans have been created for both our Year 6 Farewell and our Presentation Days to ensure COVID-19 restrictions are adhered to. While I'm aware that not everyone will be happy with these plans, I urge you to be understanding of what has to be taken into account in this planning and finding the best fit for our school.

### Year 6 Farewell

Our Farewell will only have Year 6 students attending along with school staff. Parents will have the opportunity to take photos at the front of the school in special photo locations which will be set up along Edward Street. Students will then enter the school for a fun filled evening. Due to spacing restrictions, parents will not attend the Farewell, however there will be many photos taken of the night to support our student's memories of their last year at primary school. Invitations will go to students very soon with more details.

### Presentation Days

Our Presentation Days will be held over 4 days to allow one family member to attend for those students who are receiving special awards only. Again, this is due to spacing restraints as outlined in recent Covid guidelines. Students who are receiving special awards will receive their award in the hall, given to them by the executive teacher for the Stage and myself. Our Student Captains and Vice Captains will host the Presentation Day ceremony and this will be streamed live to each classroom in the Stage. Parents and carers will be contacted directly if their child is receiving a special award. We will ensure there are lots of photos taken to share with our school community.




## Days missed = years lost

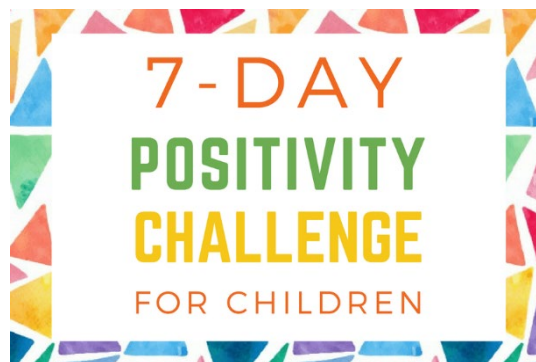
# Chaplain's Corner
