## From the Principal

Welcome to Week 7!

As we work on the many, many tasks to be finalised prior to the end of the year we'd like to give parents the opportunity to share with us some details regarding class placement for their children next year. Each year, our executives and class teachers spend a great deal of time on creating the following year's class lists. Many things are considered including social needs, academic needs, support in learning needs, friendship groupings, just to name a few. For our Kinder 2023 students, this will mean time in a Kindergarten classroom with a Kindergarten teacher, away from Mum and Dad. We will start and finish our Orientation sessions as a large group in the hall. Please remember that these sessions will run from 9.00am – 11.00am.

Tomorrow will be our Kindergarten Expo where we will have lots of information to share with you all about what to expect next year as well as how to purchase uniforms, order from the canteen and much, much more. We look forward to seeing you all then.

#### **Christmas Countdown - 34 Days till Christmas**

#### **Parenting Programs 2023**

We are busy finalising our Parenting Program calendar for 2023 and hope to have some information out by the end of year to help parents plan for the programs they would like to attend. We will see the return of No Scaredy Cats as well as Tuning Into Kids and Bringing Up Great Kids - Parenting Adolescents. Each of these programs will be offered to our parents for free.

One of the programs that I would like to give a little more information about is 'No Scaredy Cats', a program to help parents of children who may be anxious, highly nervous or need help building some resilience.

No Scaredy Cats looks into the cause of anxiety and fear behaviours in children, what this looks like and how we (as parents) can support them to develop skills to minimise its impact.

One of the places we have seen anxious students this year is in the transition back to school following each holiday. This is something we have seen a bit more in 2022, which is not surprising given that it has been our first year without a covid lock down. Many of our students are still trying to make sense of what happened with covid and during the holiday breaks, many of them get to spend dedicated time with their parents/carers, the people who they feel safest with in the world, something that is extremely comforting to them. It is natural then, that they are reluctant to leave the safety of those relationships and return to their school setting. This is going to be even more true when we look at returning in 2023 after a long summer break.

If you think this may be an issue for your child, please consider having conversations with them now and all through the break about what the return to school will look like. One of the things that 'No Scaredy Cats' teaches us, is that we need to continually develop our children's ability to face situations where they are nervous/anxious so that they can work through the discomfort when needed. This is a skill just like any other. Ways that you can support next years transition now include:-

- Practicing mindfulness activities.
- Discussing/recording the things about school they enjoy.
- Start a countdown calendar for return to school.
- Make a collage/scrapbook about the highlights from this year.
- Start engaging in physical activities, make them a part of each day.
- Talk about times when you are nervous/anxious and how you deal with these feelings (role modelling).


## Stage 3 Update

this unit, our students have created some awesome artworks. Students have also been doing maths in the sun and researching countries of their choice.
























#### From the Office

Follow the instructions and enter your payment details etc. Please note, you are not required to enter the student registration number. Contact the office if you need assistance or have any enquiries. Thank you.


Please note when paying by EFTPOS at the school office, there is a minimum transaction amount of \$10.00 due to fees charged to the school.
