Voluntary Contributions

This week we are asking families to pay their Family Voluntary Contribution if they haven't already (statement of accounts were sent home with students last Thursday). While Contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family contributes to the cost of supplementing funding gained from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth Governments. The contribution will be used to support programs in a number of learning

areas. These areas are outlined below:

- Library Resource books/resources;
- Literacy resources (e.g. supplementary reading books and home readers);
- Mathematics and Science resources;
- Physical Education and sporting resources;
- Information Technology resources;
- Performing and Visual Arts materials;
- Classroom items such as pencils, paints, exercise books, paper etc.

We understand the financial pressures on all our families and this is why our school has kept the contribution levels the same for a number of years.

Goal Setting

This week our students will meet with teachers to set learning goals for the semester. These learning goals will be shared with you, as parents and family members, during Speed Interviews in Week 10. Setting goals are important for many reasons; it focuses children on the importance of building on knowledge at their individual pace; it allows for differences and differentiation; it gives children ownership of their learning and allows teachers to gain a clear insight into what children feel is important in their steps in learning and most importantly; it gives teachers and children the chance to work together for greater student success.

And on a final note for this week, a big shout out to our students who swam their hearts out at the Zone Swimming Carnival on Friday. You made us proud of your wonderful efforts, the personal bests that were gained and your amazing and continued sportsmanship. Thanks to Mr Cronin and Mr Potts and to our parents for accompanying our children to this event.

Year 6 to 7 Online Enrolment Transition

Dear Parents/Carers of Year 6 students,

To enrol your child in Year 7 for 2024, you will need to complete an Expression of Interest for Year 6 to Year 7 transition. The Expression of Interest (EOI) lets you indicate which school(s) you would like your child to attend in Year 7.

The EOI process will now be available online on our Schools website (address below), from the 6th of March up until the 31st of March 2023. After you submit an EOI and it has been assessed, your child will be offered a place at a high school.

If your child will not be attending a NSW Government high school next year, please let us know by completing a Placement Not Required (PNR) form (also located on our school website enrolment page).

If you are unsure whether they will be attending a NSW Government school (you've applied for a private school, or you are moving interstate), we ask that you still complete an EOI and follow up with your school once a decision has been made.

The online process will guide you through your options and collect the information required to make the process as smooth as possible. This process can be completed on a mobile phone, tablet or computer.

If you have any problems completing the enrolment form online, please contact the school office for assistance.



Road safety

Hold your child's hand

As pedestrians, children can be easily distracted and are often too small to be seen by drivers. They may be unable to predict or identify dangers and tend to act impulsively.

Talk with your child about safe behaviour on the footpath – it's not a safe place to play as it is near the road and vehicles may be entering or exiting driveways.

Until your child is at least eight years old, hold their hand:

- · on the footpath
- · in the car park
- · when crossing the road.

Up until at least 10 years old, supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road.

If you can't be with your child, organise for another trusted adult to accompany them.

After school, meet your child at the school gate. At the end of the school day children may be excited, distracted or tired and often not concentrating on their own safety.

Messages to share with your children in Kindergarten to Year 2

- · Hold a grown up's hand when:
 - you cross the road
 - you're on the footpath
 - you're in a car park
- Hold an adult's hand when you cross the road

Messages to share with children in Years 3 to 6

- Use a safe place to cross the road
- Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross the road and keep checking until safely across
