# From the Principal

Welcome to Week 4!

Thank you to all our parents, grandparents and carers who came along last week to make our Book Week, Book Fair and Grandparents and Friends Day such successes. A massive thank you must go to Mrs Hanly who coordinated the activities across the week including the Book Week parade and book fair. Another thank you must also go to the staff who assisted across the week, making changes to plans and programs as needed to accommodate the activities.

Last week saw our first of three kindergarten orientation sessions for our 2024 kindergarten students. This is an extremely important transition program for our new students as it allows them to develop relationships with other students as well as staff at school. It also provides opportunities to experience the routines and expectations of school life. If any parents know of families who are yet to enrol their kindergarten child for the 2024 school year, please let them know about our orientation program. The second orientation morning will be this Thursday starting at 9:00am.

Currently Tenambit Public School does not have a P&C Association, and this is something I have spoken with many parents about re-instating. A P&C Association can be an integral part of a school, providing parents and members of the local community a voice within Tenambit Public School. As there is not currently a P&C Association operating at TPS, there are a number of steps that need to be undertaken to start a new P&C Association. The first step is to hold a meeting that is open to all parents of students that attend Tenambit Public School as well as members of the community that Tenambit Public

School services. This initial meeting will be held on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November at 5:30pm at Easts Golf Club downstairs meeting room. The aim of this initial meeting is simply to gauge the interest in re-instating the P&C Association at Tenambit Public School and forming a working group to undertake the preparation work for the foundation meeting.

There is a minimum of 7 members of the school community needed to attend this meeting to ensure the P&C Association requirements are met.

Strong schools are backed by strong school communities and having a P&C Association back at Tenambit Public School will greatly benefit our students and the wider community. I hope you are able to make our meeting on the 13<sup>th</sup> November to start this process.

Beginning this term Kindergarten have been enjoying going out on a Monday morning to the garden at school with Jesse.








During book week students enjoyed the book fair, emoji book title hunt, book week parade and Grand-friends day!




















# **BOOK PARADE**

# Strengthening bonds through family meals

### Orders

If your child has an order in and you are not able to send them to school because they are sick, you must ring the office by 9.20am to enable this order to be cancelled, and you will be refunded your money.

After 9.20am it is too late to cancel the order as the food has already commenced preparation and the process of cooking has already started.

# I.O.U.

If the school canteen has provided your student with a lunch order and sent an invoice home for payment, please note you can now log into Flexischools and use the I.O.U function to pay the money owing to the Canteen. If you are trying to do this on the same day – please ensure you choose the date for the following day, (as cut off for everything is 9.15am) and the system will not allow you to enter it for the same date if after 9.15am.

### Order

- 1 Place your Order
  - On the app home screen, scroll down to view your school services such as canteen and uniforms. Then **swipe left and right** to view all available services.
- Make your Selection

Find the service and press 'Order', then select the items you wish to order.

Make Payment

Select your payment option and complete payment to place your order.



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### From the Office

If sending cash in with your child to make a payment at the office, please ensure you send the correct money as we do not carry a float.

Our preferred payment option is via the new School Bytes Parent Portal. Instructions for downloading School Bytes has previously been sent home and was available in our previous Newsletters. If you require any assistance, please contact the office.

Please note when paying by EFTPOS at the school office, there is a minimum transaction amount of \$10.00 due to fees charged to the school.

# **Medication at School**

Please note if your child commences medication at school, parents must come into the office to complete an "Administer Medication Form" and must also supply a letter from the Doctor/Paediatrician stating medication dosage and times. Any medication must be supplied in prescribed Webster packs showing students name and dosage.

If your child requires antibiotics at any time, we still require the "Administer Medication Form" completed and signed by parents prior to giving your child the antibiotics.

This also applies for any Asthma Puffers, form to be completed and puffer to have a prescription label on it.

For students having regular prescribed medication at school, they must bring their own water bottle with them to the office to take their medication. We do not have the facilities to supply cups for students.

# **Extended Leave - Students**

If you are planning to take your child out of school for a family holiday during the school term, you must contact the school office a week prior to organise completion of a Department of Education Extended Leave Form. This must then be signed by the Principal and a section is given back to you to carry with you during this time.
